How long have you been breeding Hungarian Vizslas?		Everyone starts somewhere but a person with a long breeding history should have a notable online presence so do some googling
What other breeds of dog do you breed?		Someone who is breeding Lots of different breeds may be working commercially as a puppy sales outlet rather than a direct interest in the breed.
How many litters do you have a year?		Over 3 litters and license is required
Have you got a breeding license?		Anyone breeding three litters of any type of dog requires a license.
If you have a breeding license what star rating is it?		More info here https://www.thekennelclub.org.uk/breeding/dog-breeding-regulation/
Are your dogs kennel club registered?		Only consider kennel club registered parents.
Will you be registering the puppies with the UK Kennel club?		Only consider kennel club registered puppies.
Kennel club registered name of the sire		You can check his details on https://www.thekennelclub.org.uk/services/public/mateselect/
Kennel club registered name of the dam		You can check her details on https://www.thekennelclub.org.uk/services/public/mateselect/
How old is the Dam		She should be at least 2 years old and less than 8 years old
When did the dam last have a litter		There should be 12 months minimum between litters

Hip scores of sire and Dam	Sire / total = Dam / total =	The available range is 0/0 to 53/53 perfect hips being 0/0 and hips with severe dysplasia being 53/53 Lower the score and more even the better. The breed average is a total of 12
Elbow scores of sire and Dam	Sire / total = Dam / total =	Possible grades are 0 to 3 with 0 being clear and 3 being affected The score is based upon the worst elbow so a score of 0/3 would be a grade of 3 Only grades of 0 or 1 should be considered for breeding
Are the parents eye tested for Glaucoma (PLA)	Sires result = Dams result =	A relatively new test for vizslas so not all dogs will be screened Possible results are 0-3 0 unaffected 1 mild 2 moderate 3 severe Only dogs with grades 0-2 should be considered for breeding.
Are the parent's DNA tested for Cerebellar ataxia?	Sires result = Dams result =	At least on parent should be tested clear
Are there any health concerns I should be aware of ?		Both parents should be healthy dogs and consideration should have been given to historic cases of epilepsy, auto immune disorders etc in the pedigree.

Where will the puppies be born?		It is desirable for puppies to be born in the home?
Where will the puppies be reared?		There's no right or wrong answer but the puppies should be exposed to daily homelife even if the breeder makes use of kennelling as well.
Will the puppies follow socialisation plan?		Ideally your puppy should be following a plan such as www.thepuppyplan.com
What deposits are taken and when?		Some breeders take deposits to join a waiting list, others to reserve a puppy and others not at all. It is the choice of the individual breeder but just be clear what is expected.
Howe much will my puppy cost in total?		Its up to the individual breeder how they price their puppy again be sure it is clear and preferably in writing.
Will I be given a sales receipt?		You should expect to receive a receipt of sale for your puppy.
Will I receive a sales contract?		Many breeders issues sales contracts you should be able to read this before agreeing to buy.
Will my puppy carry registration endorsements?		There are two endorsements commonly used R progeny not for registration X not for export More information can be found here www.thekennelclub.org.uk
What age can I visit my puppy?		Normal age is aged five weeks or over.

Will I see my puppies mother when I visit ?		The answer should be yes.
What age will I take my puppy home?		The law states puppies must be 8 weeks or over .
Will my puppy be microchipped prior to collection?		The law states puppies must be microchipped and registered to their breeder as the first keeper. Some breeders will make the transfer to your ownership for you, but ultimately you are responsible for this.
Will I receive a puppy pack?		
Will my puppy be vet checked ?		Ideally your puppy will have been vet checked prior to homing
What happens if my vet finds a health concern at the first vet check?		Agreed policy should be documented in your sales contract.
Will I receive support if needed?		Good breeders will of a support service by phone/email or social media.
What happens if I can't keep my dog for any reason?		Good breeders will assist you in rehoming your dog.
